Dear Friends

"People used to think about a new car or iPhone, but nobody was thinking about peace. Now, we are dreaming of it. When old people used to wish each other peace, we didn't understand what they meant. Now we do."

The wonderful thing about scripture is that it is a living and breathing document as relevant today as when it was written. It speaks to each generation afresh.

For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Hebrews Ch 4 vs 12.

As we read scripture, some elements resonate with us more than others. Methodists traditionally use a fourfold approach to learn about our Christian faith and apply it to contemporary issues and to our Christian practice:

Scripture - We seek to discover the word of God through reading the Bible.

Tradition - This is the wisdom and creativity of Christians over time and across the world.

Reason - To the best of our ability we need to think things through in the light of reason.

Experience - Methodism particularly stresses the importance of our own experience of God's grace working in our lives. We gain wisdom and maturity from life experience.

We read scripture through the lenses of our experience, and reflect on our experience through the lenses of scripture. If we are not careful, this in itself can lead to conflict; for why can another person not see what I see? Well this is understandable because our experiences are so significantly diverse. I would understand if the old people in Kyiv had got frustrated with the young people prioritising monetary possessions ahead of priceless values.

When Jesus was with his disciples during the last supper he said:

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid. John Ch 16 vs 27.
