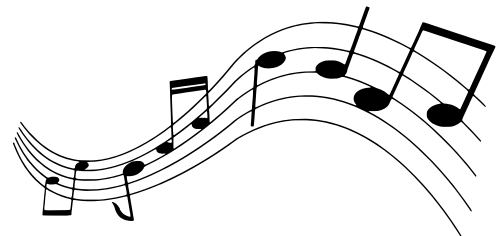
## *Last Session of The Bible Course*

Dear Friends

I was asked this week what I felt was the most significant consequence of Covid, given we are two years on from the start of the pandemic. On the day in question I answered by saying it was the uncertainty that it has generated in people. I think I was especially reflecting on my observation of young people although it can equally apply to all ages.

Separately on the same day, unrelated to Covid, I read an article titled "learning to live with uncertainty", which stated:

*It's OK to feel uncomfortable about uncertainty. Rather than grabbing for certainty, we need to sit with uncertainty and recognise that it feels uncomfortable. By showing yourself compassion in difficult situations, you can reduce feelings of stress and anxiety.*

The article went on to recommend that we should ground ourselves when we feel uncertainty gets too much. One such way is to be aware of the present, to live in the moment. In this week's bible reading, Jesus is continuing his journey towards Jerusalem, tensions are rising, it was six days before the passover feast, and he is in Bethany with Martha and Mary:

*Mary took about a pint of pure nard, an expensive perfume; she poured it on Jesus' feet and wiped his feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume.*

I imagine for a moment the tensions subsided as the fragrance overran their senses. Mary is criticised by some although not by Jesus, for he says:

*Leave her alone, it was intended that she should save this perfume for the day of my burial.*

In a time of uncertainty about the future, Mary grounds the household in the moment. Whatever uncertainties we face, may we be able to focus on Jesus in the present. For in an uncertain world, his gift to us is always certain.

*Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."*
