Dear Friends,

As you were gathered for worship together on October 30th, I was experiencing worship for the first time at the Danube International Church in Budapest, Hungary.

The building didn't look like our traditional churches (more like a modern theatre) .

I was warmly greeted at the door and as a newcomer took a seat along the back row to be joined by an American guy who was the church pastor and married to a Methodist lady from the UK.

"Connection" from pre service felt comfortable, the worship was lead by a young praise band with familiar songs in English. A meet and greet session involved those of us attending for the first time sharing our name, home country and reason for our visit. A lay person dressed in his running attire spoke on endurance and perseverance for a life of faith as we hear in Hebrews 12 verses 1-3

And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, 2 fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. 3 Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

We were encouraged with those around us to chat together about the barriers and distractions that get in the way of living a faith filled, joy filled life. What a privilege to be a part of this and feel so "at home" on a first visit. The chatter continued post service over coffee and the atmosphere was party like and spirit filled. Praise be to God.

I encourage you to take notice how 'being church' happens in new ways within and outside of the UK as we endeavour to grow God's Kingdom. What reflections come to mind from the experience of worshipping with other denominations within our local community?
