Dear Friends

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I always thank my God for you because of his grace given you in Christ Jesus. For in him you have been enriched in every way—with all kinds of speech and with all knowledge.

Please receive the above paragraph with my heartfelt good wishes. Whilst it is part of the opening exhortations of Paul's letter to the Church in Corinth (1 Corinthians Ch 1 vs 3-5), they do replicate what I sincerely want to express to you.

This sounds like a prelude to me seeking forgiveness for something (or everything)! It's not; in part because I'm probably well beyond that point. Only a few verses on, in verse 10, Paul writes...

I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another in what you say and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly united in mind and thought.

Ah, the penny's dropped, Paul was just buttering them up in the opening lines for the sucker punch that was to follow from verse 10 onwards. Well, I think the *"Grace and peace to you..."* sentences are not there just to butter people up. Rather they are there to remind them (and us), of the significant context in which we are allowed to be, a context where grace abounds. Paul offers grace (and peace) to people *"from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ"*. Paul understands himself as a vessel, a conduit for God's grace; and there can be nothing more valuable than such grace. Paul further reiterates his thanks to God for the grace God has given that community. Such grace is not a gift to be put on the mantel piece like an ornament that we no longer see after a while, rather it is like a never ending supply of fine garments, one that we are never to be without ourselves, and the rest that we are to freely give away to others.
