Dear Friends



I write this on letter on Thursday which in some Christian traditions is the day we remember the presentation of Lord, the day that Mary and Jospeh took Jesus to the temple as a baby. There they encounter Simeon and then Anna.

Simeon took Jesus in his arms and praised God, saying: "Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you may now dismiss[d] your servant in peace.

For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all nations: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel." 33 The child's father and mother marvelled at what was said about him. (Luke Ch 2 vs 28-33)

There was also a prophet, Anna, the daughter of Penuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old; she had lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, and then was a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped night and day, fasting and praying. Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of lerusalem.

When Joseph and Mary had done everything required by the Law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee to their own town of Nazareth. And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was on him.

(Luke Ch 2 vs 36-40)

I imagine this story was retold many times in the home of Jesus as he was growing up. I imagine him being embarrassed by it whilst at the same same time wanting to hear again the words of encouragement from Simeon and Anna.

We all need encouragement. Who has encouraged you recently? Do we hear encouragement or do we block it out? When someone compliments us do we say "oh it was noting really"?

To whom can you be an encouragement each day? You are the salt of the earth, let your light shine before others.
