### Coronation Day Celebration

On Saturday 6th May we will be showing the coronation of King Charles III in the church lounge on the large television.

The day will begin with Tea/Coffee and breakfast pastries being served in the build up to the ceremony and tea and coffee served during the coronation.

After the Coronation, share in a picnic lunch in the garden, when we will toast the new King with some non-alcoholic fizz.

There will be a competition for guests to design and make their own crown or big hat for the day, also there will be a royal quiz with prizes for the winners of both.

So please put the date in your diaries and come along and enjoy this historical day.

I wonder what your memories of the last coronation are, if you are old enough to remember. I remember the Silver Jubilee. My class won the competition to collect old newspapers and so got to ride on the special Jubilee double decker bus to the school picnic where we were given a commemorative teaspoon. A teaspoon much appreciated by 10 year olds (not)! Although I have now discovered that the Archbishop will pour holy oil from the ampulla into a spoon, and anoint the King Charles III on the hands, breast and head, a tradition goes back to the Old Testament and the anointing of Solomon by Zadok the Priest. Where's that teaspoon when you need it?

In fact, the spoon the Archbishop will use is the oldest item in the crown jewels and dates from the 12th century. The oil comes from the Mount of Olives, pressed outside Jerusalem and consecrated in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem. It was on the Mount of Olives that Jesus wept over Jerusalem: "If you, even you, had only recognized on this day the things that make for peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes."

Nothing has changed.

Thy Kingdom Come, is a global ecumenical prayer movement that invites Christians to pray from Ascension to Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus. To know the Jesus we name as the Prince of Peace. As tensions rise in Jerusalem, as we wait for the anticipated spring offensive in Ukraine, as we see the violence in Sudan, Yemen, Syria, may we join our prayers together for peace. As we share the good news of Jesus with friends and neighbours, may we also be good news for the world as we work for peace and justice. One way we can do this is by supporting Christian Aid who work with the world's poorest people and campaign to change the systems that keep people poor – the things that are often hidden from our eyes. As the Carolean era begins – let us consecrate ourselves to the work of God's kingdom -our hands, our hearts and our minds, so that all the world may rejoice (start the music to Handel's Zadok the Priest ..... Long live the King.... Amen, amen, alleluia, alleluia, amen, amen).
