WHAT'S THE BEST NEWS YOU'VE EVER HEARD?



Everyone is invited to join this seven session course based on the Gospel of Mark. Sonya highly recommends it and Christianity Explored has been run previously with great reception at Leyland Road.

Dear friends,

When thinking about the biblical basis for mission we look to Jesus 'command to 'go and make disciples of all nations '. These words from Mathew 28 comprise what we know as the Great Commission; "and Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age '(Mathew 28 vs 18-20)

Jesus uses the word " all " four times ;

all authority

to go to all nations to communicate all his teaching empowered by his presence all of the time (always)

What do the four 'alls' mean for us? Jesus spoke these words give us courage in the task. The burden isn't on us but on the One with authority. Jesus didn't call his followers to his mission, he called them to himself and sent them on mission. So if we're walking with Jesus this command is incumbent in us. As we go about our daily lives within the community, live and love like Jesus, be confident in his authority, abide in his presence.

During this month of May let us connect with nature and each other, embrace change and look to new beginnings and prosperity. As circuit stewards we had the privilege last week of meeting with stewards from Formby to prepare to welcome them into the Southport circuit.
