Dear Friends

We have all been aghast at the images on our television screens from Israel and the Gaza strip. The events have caused me to reflect on my own understanding of the situation, with the feeling I could be better informed. Trying to find a balanced view is not always easy. If you feel the same then the following may be of interest.

Firstly, "Start the Week" on Radio 4 focused on Israel (available at <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/sounds/play/m001r7ft</u>). The Editor of the Jewish Chronicle Jake Wallis Simons discusses his book "Israelophobia" in which he argues that throughout history Jews have been hated for their religion and their race, and that now anti-Semitism is focused on their nation-state. Then the journalist Nathan Thrall who has been reporting in Israel and Palestine for many years, discusses his book "The Day in the Life of Abed Salama" which reveals the every day life of Palestinians in one of the most contested places on earth.

Secondly, the United Nations website ponders "The Question of Palestine" (https://www.un.org/unispal/history/), and the associated linked pages give an enlightening resume of the history behind the conflict, in which Britain's role (plus that of other nations) is uncomfortably interesting.

Statement on the escalation of violence in Israel-Palestine

From the Methodist Liaison office in Jerusalem

We are witnesses to the escalation of violence in the region and we call on the global Methodist people to continue to pray for peace and for an end to the violence.

Pray for those who have lost family members and livelihoods, the injured, for those who perpetuate violence and for world leaders that they may work for peace, the churches and all religious leaders and for those who work for peace in the region.

The situation is complicated, and we recognise the fear and sense of injustice that are felt, but we call on both sides not to resort to further violence and to engage in negotiation to establish a peaceful solution for all who live in the Holy Land.
