

<sup>•</sup> I am sure that we all feel overwhelmed by the images coming out of the Middle East. As I write, Joe Biden has visited the area where the diplomatic effort resulted in a planned meeting with the king of Jordan, the president of Egypt and the Palestinian president, although the hospital bomb has resulted in its cancellation. Whilst a convoy of 20 aid trucks will pass into Gaza is positive, given 2 million people are in need this feels woefully low.

We can feel helpless as we look on. What difference can we make?

A prayer on the Methodist Church website relating to the conflict reads:

Loving God, I see the news and I am afraid. Violence is spiralling out of control. I don't know what to think or feel. The temptation to fall into hatred, or despair feels very close at hand. Help me to remember that nothing in all creation can separate me from your love that I know in Jesus. May your perfect love for me cast out my fear and free me to discern what is mine to do amidst the chaos of this suffering world. Amen

I find the last line helpful; to "discern what is mine to do amidst the chaos of this suffering world". As Christians we are called to be peacemakers and reconciler's. That is what Jesus came into the world to do, to reconcile us to God, to one another, and to leave us with his peace. Paul writing to the church in Thessalonica says:

And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia.

Whilst we may currently feel overwhelmed by the news and feeling helpless as to what we can do, may we discern what is ours to do where we are. Wherever that may be, as followers of Jesus we are called to be imitators of him as we to work for reconciliation and peace.
