#### **Dear Friends**

Whilst on vacation it was wonderful to attend Paynes Bay

Methodist Church in Barbados on Sunday 7th January, which was
the occasion of their Covenant Service. I especially value the Covenant
Service, so it was good that I could participate without being involved in
leading the service.

There are set readings offered as part of the Covenant Service, and the preacher chose ones of these; the vine and the branches from John Ch 15.

"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." (John Ch 15 vs 5)

Some translations have the word "abide" instead of "remain", which I find helpful. I think this weeks set gospel reading would also work well for a Covenant Service. It's the calling of the first disciples from Mark Ch 1 vs 14-20. In Mark's style the story moves at a fast pace.

"Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people." At once they left their nets and followed him. (Mark Ch 1 vs 17-18)

I wonder what lead-up the fishermen had prior to this moment. How much had they known of Jesus or heard him themselves? We are reminded in this passage that there comes a point of making a decision to follow the way of Jesus. In many ways this can be the relatively easy part, for what follows is living it out in our daily lives. And so too with the Covenant Prayer, which whilst challenging, is relatively easy to speak. The hard part comes in the lived reality.

The encouragement is that the disciples also struggle with living their commitment to Jesus' calling. In the courtyard the night before the crucifixion, warming himself before the fire, Peter threatens to give up a lifetime of fidelity for a moment of fear.

Having made the Covenant commitment, when struggles come through this year, may we reach out to God in the midst of our fears.
