Dear Friends

As I write I'm with the probationer ministers from the North of England who have gathered for their annual retreat. I attend as District Probationers Secretary. A couple of things have struck me.

Firstly, whilst I know we are struggling to appoint a new Superintendent Minister from September 2024, there are excellent Probationer Ministers who will be ordained in the next couple of years. Whilst this doesn't help our immediate predicament it does bode well for the future. There was a reduction in those entering training around the Covid years, although I understand those applying to commence training from this September has increased significantly. We continue to pray for our own situation.

Secondly, what an amazing role our churches, and you as congregations play in promoting social justice. Rachel Lampard has been leading the retreat and you may remember Rachel from when she preached at our recent Circuit Service on the theme of "a Justice Seeking Church".

He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God. (Micah Ch 6 vs 8)

Part of me sinks when I hear of yet another Methodist initiative with everything else that is going on. A key element of Rachel's message has been to encourage us to look at what churches are already doing regarding social justice, and to value it as that, rather than try and start a new set of initiatives when people are already stretched.

Perhaps too often we beat ourselves up for what we are not doing rather than celebrating everything we are doing. Just one example of how we are a Justice Seeking Church is how we use our resources. We have some great facilities in our buildings (despite their challenges), and every time we make these available to the community it provides a place for those to who would otherwise be isolated. As we look around our churches and congregations, let's celebrate all that promotes the heart of God for social justice.
