So what is consuming your energy and attention at the moment? Perhaps you are a carer or supporting someone in need in some way, or you are the one being cared for; maybe the busyness of work is consuming you; you may have very practical issues, such as financial concerns or coping with day to day living; relationships may be strained or in need of reconciliation which may or may not appear realistic. We all come with a myriad of concerns.

As part of the 150th Anniversary of Formby Methodist Church I've just attended a fantastic concert including Voiceworks choir from Formby High School. As I was walking towards the church I was wondering where God was going to be within the evening.

The first song was "What I was made for"

As he said himself, "the hour has come". We all have a calling, and as the Methodist Covenant Prayer reminds "some are easy, others are difficult". Jesus understands the difficulty in accepting a calling; he is with you in your calling.

Next came "Actions speak louder than words"
