Dear Friends

"Are ye dancing?" "Are ye asking?..."

As I have been preparing for Trinity Sunday, I came across this prayer in the Methodist Prayer Handbook.

Eternal and glorious Trinity, for whom we thirst and long; for ever let us desire your light, seek your face and wrap ourselves in the robe of your majesty and love. Amen. Catherine of Sienna (c. 1347-1380)

I invite you for a time to live with this prayer, perhaps for a few minutes as part of a quiet time, or maybe longer as you journey through a day or the week. How does it speak to you, do the words resonate with you, where does it take you?

Catherine was a mystic with a strong sense of the presence of the divine in union with us. I love the economic way in which Catherine chooses her words, whilst they are expansive enough to enabling us to dwell deeper upon them.

"Trinity" replaces the word "God" in the prayer. This acknowledges God is three in one, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Catherine thirsts and longs to experience all aspects and manifestations of the Trinity; and asks that this craving for the Trinity will be forever.

Matthew Ch 4 vs 16-17 says, "The people who live in darkness have seen a great light, and for those living in the shadowland of death, light has dawned". In Colossians Ch 1 vs 15 Paul writes, "And He is the image of the invisible God, the first born of all creation". And God the Son humbled himself and made his dwelling amongst us, and as his disciples we seek to be Christ-like. We are assured that we do not toil alone for "when the Father sends the Advocate as my representative—that is, the Holy Spirit—he will teach you everything and will remind you of everything I have told you." (John 14:26).

Some call the "trinity" the "divine dance" to which we are invited to join

"...I'm asking" "then I'm dancing".
