#### Dear Friends

With a General Election pending, I share some reflections from the Joint Public Issues Team of the Methodist Church and its ecumenical partners.

The late Archbishop Desmond Tutu observed, "When people say that religion and politics don't mix, I wonder which Bible it is they are reading." The Bible tells the story of God's intimate concern with how human societies are ordered and governed, and stresses the particular responsibilities of those with power to judge wisely, act mercifully, protect the vulnerable, speak truth, and uphold justice. Through the incarnation, Jesus immersed himself in the injustices and sufferings of the world and the political issues of his day.

Christians have an important role to play in elections: to love, to pray, and to vote. As we follow Jesus's commandment to love our neighbours, we must debate with kindness, ask questions, demand honest answers and be offended when truth is not offered. We are called too to listen to those on the margins, seek good news for the poor, and stand up for those who are vulnerable.

Parties and candidates will have their own carefully selected messages to share, which may not include the issues that we most care about. How can the scandal of foodbanks be ended? How can we avert climate catastrophe? How can we ensure refugees are treated fairly and humanely? You will have others. In playing our part in this General Election, we have the opportunity to raise these questions above the fog, and hold candidates accountable to providing solutions which work for the good of all.

#### A prayer for voters

Loving God, we face a choice. Be with us as we consider the options weigh the arguments and assess the claims and the candidates. But also prompt us to listen: to the voices on the margins to the cry of the earth and to those who reach a different conclusion to us. God, we pray that you would stimulate our minds stir our hearts and sanctify our choosing. Help us also to remember your command to love our neighbours both during and after this election.
