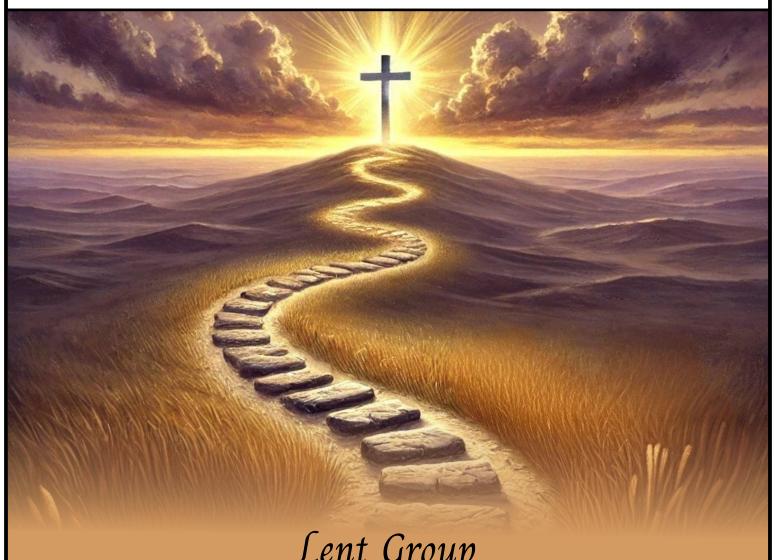

### Growing in Trust

Worrying is actually a way of preventing us from experiencing intimacy with God because it focuses on self. Worrying is so often about 'me', about what I fear what might or might not happen. It is a way of being tied to an imagined gloomy future of our own making, rather than being free to engage with the present moment where God meets us, where we can dwell until the Holy Spirit reveals the next step on the journey.

Constant worrying knocks us off balance, and undermines our sense of God's goodness and provision. God wants us to enjoy 'the glorious freedom of the children of God' (Romans 8.21b NIV). The good news is that one of the consequences of following Jesus, of allowing God into our deepest centre with all its fears and quirkiness, is that, as our trust grows, our worries begin to diminish and gradually we relinquish to Christ their power to hold centre-stage in our lives.

Our ability to trust God grows as our relationship with Him deepens, as we study and learn more about His character and faithfulness, and as we come to know for ourselves that we are precious in God's sight. It grows, too, as we practise letting go of our need to control our environment, to micro-manage events and people around us as a way of coping with our anxiety.

The movement away from worry to trust is often seen in the stories in Scripture such as Mark 6 verse 50 and Luke 8 verse 50.
