

**Dear Friends** 

I hope you've had a blessed Easter Day. We awoke on Easter Monday to the news that Pope Francis had died. The Methodist Church issued a statement, part of which says:

The Methodist Church in Britain receives with deep sadness the news of the death of His Holiness Pope Francis, and gives thanks for his life and Christian witness... Methodists join in these days in prayer and sympathy with our Catholic sisters and brothers, who have lost their Holy Father, recognising the pain that this brings. Methodists will also offer prayers in the days ahead for the Catholic Church, as she navigates this period.



This moment brings into focus once more, that despite being different denominations, "we believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church". These familiar words came from the Council of Nicaea, and this year marks the 1700th anniversary of its first council. The outcome of the Council was the Nicene Creed which is the most widely-accepted creed in the Christian faith, used by many denominations including our own. It is a reminder of the common faith we share, both with Christians around the world today and throughout history.

As I reference Pope Francis, I wonder if some feel it is inappropriate to do so given the schisms in the Church. This reminds me that the Church in so many ways is like a normal family, and by normal I of course mean dysfunctional! Like so many families we find from time to time relationships are strained with things we disagree with. Equally we can be drawn together when tragedy strikes. When one part of the Church hurts, we all hurt, when one part of the Church rejoices, we all rejoice.

At our Circuit Service on the 4th May at Leyland Road Methodist

Church, we will celebrate the gift that is the Nicene Creed. As the Methodist Circuit in Southport, we are reminded we are gathered from individual churches, into Districts and the Connexion. Locally we are one with our ecumenical friends, both locally and globally. In this anniversary year of the Nicene Creed, may we more than ever recognise all we share in common, rather than that which may seek to divide us.


