Sunday 30 November marks the start of the season of Advent. The word Advent comes for the Latin meaning coming, the coming of the Lord; and so we get the familiar Advent refrain "Come Lord Come". Traditionally Christians have used the days leading up to Christmas to prepare, to get ready. Just think for a moment of facing the task of decorating a room. Before you can apply the paint or hang new wallpaper you need to strip the surfaces of the old paint, perhaps smooth the rough surfaces, removed the old coverings so the walls are ready to receive their new covering that you have carefully chosen. To just stick the new on top of the old would be possible but it wouldn't feel right, it would be less than perfect. We are, of course not perfect and the colour of violet or purple for vestments and decorations during the season of Advent denotes a period of repentance as we seek to deal with the things in our lives which get in the way of our preparation for the feast of Christmas.

The same is true for us as we prepare for Christmas, the spiritual preparations are as important, if not more so than the buying of presents, wrapping of gifts, writing of card and the putting up of decorations.

So, as we prepare for Christmas may we use the days of Advent to prepare ourselves, to make the rough places in our hearts and minds smooth (to use an analogy from the prophet Isaiah) so there is no hindrance for the Lord's entry when he comes. To help us prepare we will light a new Advent candle each of the four Sundays of Advent as we watch and wait with all God's people with hope, peace, joy and love in our hearts. Our lectionary readings help us focus for the journey by drawing on the themes of God's people, God's prophets, John the Baptist and the Blessed Virgin Mary and their roles in pointing us towards the one who comes.

As we contemplate the world's conflicts and divisions may we pray for peace and work for peace, building peace in our own areas of influence as we await the coming of him who is the Prince of Peace, even Jesus Christ our Lord.

So I wish you a thoughtful Advent as you prepare and reflect on the meaning of Christ's coming among us.
