Practising the Presence of God

In the seventeenth century, a French lay brother called Lawrence left behind a series of letters which give us a glimpse of someone in love with God. Whether at work in the kitchen or sandal-making, or in formal times of prayer, he 'practised the presence of God' by repeatedly turning his mind to God, in love all through the day.

Not only did this simple practice deepen Brother Lawrence's own connection with God. But it also enabled him to be a vehicle of God's grace to those around him. There was no division between sacred and secular, between leisure and work, for he did everything for the love of God,

Every time we turn towards God in this way, we too are practising the presence of God, welcoming God into our lives, our difficulties and our dreams. As we do this more and more often during the day, we build up the holy habit of awareness of God at the centre of our lives, part of all that we are and do. This inspires and supports us as we reach out to others. Instead of thinking God is far away and disinterested, we recognise that God is close at hand, nearer than our own breathing. With this awareness, our love for God, for our neighbour and for ourselves can steadily grow.
