God is our Refuge

One of the most wonderful aspects of being a Christian is to know the truth of the old, beautiful verse:

'The eternal God is your refuge, and underneath are the ever-lasting arms'
(Deuteronomy 33.27, NIV).

This verse paints a picture of a God who is always there to hold us, to catch us if we are falling, a God who is neither fickle nor absent, but eternally, lovingly, present.

Part of the work of unpicking our fearful patterns of behaviour and thinking, is to re-examine who we think God is. This is vital because our image of God can either help or hinder our spiritual growth. If, for example, we think of God as unpredictable, punishing, emotionally distant, and physically remote, it's no wonder we would hesitate to put our trust in Him. However, if we think of the God who is made visible in Jesus – and Scripture tells us that Christ is 'the image of the Invisible God (Colossians 1.15) then, instead of viewing God as a faceless, ruthless judge, we can see someone who is loving, committed to bringing wholeness and healing, welcoming of sinners, wanting our good, full of grace and mercy, willing to risk everything for humanity.

God in Jesus, then, is a someone whom we can approach, who is trustworthy, whose right hand holds us fast no matter where we are, whatever we are doing. Looking to Christ helps us gain the trust we need to become less anxious and more able to grow in our experience and understanding of God. God in Jesus is truly our refuge in the difficult times and also the good ones.
